**From the Desk of the Provost**

I am writing this letter not because I want to, but because I feel I have to. I have been reading a number of articles about the increased instances of cheating, not only online, but also on ground. Since we work primarily with adult students, I try to tell myself that adults know better so we should not have an issue. But each year, I find that I am handling more and more cases of plagiarism, purchased papers, and stolen course material that has been posted online.

You all take a course from us in your first semester that covers plagiarism. We also subscribe to Turnitin so you can check your work to make sure you cited your sources correctly before submitting the paper. Yet, we still get a number of cases of plagiarism. When you come to Charter Oak, you agree to abide by the Student Code of Conduct. I would suggest that you read it. The plagiarism policy is in all of the courses; again, I would suggest that you read it.

When you submit work that is not your own, you are committing theft. You are stealing someone else's property and claiming it is yours. Would you steal your neighbor's car and claim it is yours? I am also surprised at how many students when caught plagiarizing say "I didn't mean to" or "I just don't know how to cite sources"—not legitimate excuses.

But beyond plagiarism, I am surprised that we have found some of our course content on web sites. Which means that someone stole copyrighted material and made money off of selling it as their own, which is illegal. This makes it easy for others to cheat. As a result, we will be implementing a more stringent cheating policy. It will be a "three strikes and you're out" policy. With the first incident, you will receive a 0 for the assignment. With the second, you will receive an F for the course or whatever course you are in at that time. With the third, you will be dismissed. If we find that you have stolen course material and put or sold it on the Internet, you will be dismissed. There will be no second chance.

I am sure you want your degree to be of value and be proud of yourself and what you have accomplished. I am also confident that most of you do not cheat, and if you were a teacher, you would not tolerate cheating by your students.

On a more positive note, once again our students did a wonderful job representing you and the College at the Connecticut Legislative Hearings. Read what they had to say further on in this newsletter. We just received word that one of our 2017 graduates, Marcia Palomino Hawk, completed her Ph.D. We enjoy hearing the success stories of our alumni and we will be highlighting a few of them at our next fundraiser.

Enjoy the rest of the semester. Spring is on its way.


## Graduate Program News

## Reminder Graduation Dates and Deadlines!

Charter Oak awards degrees three times a year (on May 31, August 31, and December 31). Diplomas will also be issued three times a year, 4-6 weeks after the May, August, and December conferral dates.

Please note that your degree **will not be awarded** if you have an outstanding balance on your account. To receive your diploma, you must also have completed your financial aid exit interview (if applicable). 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### Criteria for Letters Confirming Your Graduation

We receive a number of requests from students asking that a letter be sent to a college or to an employer verifying the date of their graduation. We are more than happy to honor this request. However, you should **not make the request unless the following criteria have ALL been met:**

1. Your concentration has been **approved**.
2. You have submitted your graduation application and survey (see deadlines for submission).
3. You have completed **all** academic requirements (contact your academic counselor).
4. **All** of your transcripts have been **received** by Charter Oak.
5. **All** fees have been paid (including the graduation fee).
6. **All financial aid requirements** have been completed.

When you have met the above criteria, requests should be made in writing to the Associate Registrar, Paul Morganti, 55 Paul J. Manafort Drive, New Britain, CT 06053, or email [pmorganti@charteroak.edu](mailto:pmorganti@charteroak.edu). The request should include the name, title and address of the recipient.

## Office of Accessibility Services

The Office of Accessibility at COSC offers services to students with disabilities. Oftentimes, students are unaware of the resources available to them to help them succeed in coursework. Students who have a documented disability (learning disability, medical, physical, or psychological disability) are entitled, under law, to accommodations such as extended time for work/assessment completion, assistance accessing alternate forms of texts, and academic coaching. The disability may be a long-standing concern or a sudden life event such as an illness or accident.

The process for obtaining accommodations is relatively simple at COSC. It starts with an email or call to Joanne Prague Doyle, Accessibilities Specialist. She can be reached at [jpraguedoyle@charteroak.edu](mailto:jpraguedoyle@charteroak.edu) or at 860-515-3846. Following the initial conversation, a student will be asked to complete two required COSC forms and provide documentation of the disability. Once all the information is submitted, appropriate accommodations are discussed and written into a formal Letter of Accommodation, which is sent to the student and to the instructor(s).

Students should not hesitate to inquire about accommodations or to seek assistance when needed. The goal is to support students in their work to earn a degree and to help smooth the path to success.

This proposed Bachelor of Science degree will have five different tracks for students to choose from:

- Early Childhood Teacher Credential (ECTC)
- Infant/Toddler
- Preschool
- Montessori

We are also very excited about our new collaborative agreement with the Center for Montessori Education|NY (CME|NY) and look forward to building a strong partnership with them to support Montessori students in achieving credit for their American Montessori Society (AMS) credentials and applying credits earned towards a college degree.

In addition, we also anticipate the start of our Associate of Science (A.S.) degree in Early Childhood Education. ### Course Evaluation Survey Results Update

Students' overall ratings of their courses and instructors were positive this past Fall 2017 term: 81% of students rated the overall effectiveness of their instructor as "High" or "Very High," and 84% of students rated the overall effectiveness of their course as "High" or "Very High."

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness would like to thank students for continuing to make the online course evaluation system a success. The purpose of course evaluation at our institution is to provide:

- 1) information for the individual faculty member to use in assessing his/her instruction,
- 2) data that may assist in making curricular and course content decisions,
- 3) data that will assist in improving the online delivery system, and
- 4) the student body with a voice in developing and maintaining an effective faculty and curriculum.

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## CHARTER OAK STATE COLLEGE STUDENTS MAKE A STAND

Connecticut's budget crisis and budget cuts impact all Connecticut citizens in one form or another and Charter Oak State College and its students are not an exception. Last Thursday, February 15, 2018, two Charter Oak State College students, Shelly Carter and Dean Rhoden, met at the Legislative Office Building in Hartford and testified before the state representatives of the Appropriations Committee urging them to continue funding and supporting Charter Oak State College, the only fully online state school.



Shelly Carter, a firefighter in Hartford and a senior at Charter Oak State College, shared her story as a working professional, a mother of five, a wife, and a student. Her dream, she shared, is to advance in her field and become chief officer. “How was I to fit earning a bachelor degree into this mix?” she asked, referencing her full work-life structure. She said that Charter Oak State College was her only option; it was affordable and the flexible structure of an online setting that made it feasible.

Carter, coming straight from work and dressed in full uniform, proudly announced to the room that she will be walking across the stage at commencement this summer and joked with the representatives that in the fall, if all works out according to her plans, they may see a new female fire chief officer in Hartford. Carter also is the organizer and mentor for an all-girl firefighter training and support group. Carter aspires to bring more women into the predominantly male field.



Dean Rhoden, an employee of the Center for Urban Research in the Adult Literacy and Transition to College Programs, has been a student at Charter Oak State College since 2015. Rhoden’s testimony supported Carter’s appeal to keep the funding of Charter Oak State College as it was his only option to earn a degree.

With a full day work schedule, Rhoden also works in the evenings keeping youths, in particular young men, safe and away from trouble.

As Scoutmaster in the Boy Scouts, Rhoden has started numerous troops and donated hours of his life to community service. He spoke to the representatives about how important having an affordable online college was to him and how it will allow him and others like him to advance in their career. Rhoden encouraged the representatives to continue to invest in the traditional colleges and universities, but to remember those who are making a difference to today’s youth. My mission,” Rhoden said “is saving one life at a time.”
